Page 334: At this time a communication from the Board of Supervisors relative to moving the W.P.A. Sewing project from the Federal Building in Balboa Park to the Food and Beverages Building was presented and read.

Supervisors Richards, Warner, Bellon, Faddis and Hart appeared before the Council relative to this proposed change affecting the W.P.A. Sewing Project.

RESOLUTION NO. 70410, recorded in Book 62 of Resolutions, referring to the City Manager and City Attorney for report and recommendation the matter of the City's obligation to furnish housing for the W.P.A. sewing project, now housed in the Federal Building, Balboa Park, was on motion of Councilman Housh, seconded by Councilman Fish, adopted.

RESOLUTION NO. 70459, recorded in Book 62 of Resolutions, filing the opinion from the City Attorney, under date of December 8, 1939, regarding the housing of the W.P.A. RESOLUTION NO. 70514, recorded in Book 62 of Resolutions, authorizing and empowering the City Manager to execute a contract on behalf of the City of San Diego for the assignment by the State Relief Administration of certain relief workers to do general maintenance work in Balboa Park, under the supervision of the City Park Department, was on motion of Councilman Fish, seconded by Councilman Knox, adopted.
